



Plants used in the display must be showing flowers only; no seed heads or berries are allowed. Foliage which is growing naturally from the flowering stem, and still attached to that stem, will be allowed. No additional foliage should be included.

Regarding presentation, it should be noted that the vase should be in proportion to the display which will be viewed from all directions.

Packing materials – in line with RHS guidelines, floral foam (Oasis) will not be permitted.

In ALL classes where a "Vase" is referred to it must conform to RHS rules i.e. it must be taller in height than it is wide at the mouth. A "Bowl" must be as wide or wider at the mouth than its height.

EXHIBITOR TIPS

Tips and advice for showing intended to help the exhibitors display their products consistently and to the best effect.

Vegetables

Classes 46 – 48 Onions and Shallots should be dressed down to the

first complete skin, have the roots trimmed and the

necks tied.

Class 53 Peas – Long fresh smooth well filled pods with a

good bloom and colour

Class 54 and 55 French and runner beans should have straight

pods with partial stalks pointing same way if possible and no outward signs of seeds in pods.

Class 56 Cucumbers should be straight, same length and

thickness with floret still attached if possible

Class 58 Marrow – optimum size 40cm long or 20cm in

dia. if round variety

Class 59 Courgettes – Tender fruit, good shape and

colour 15cm long with flowers attached

Class 60 Any other Veg. Only show one vegetable

i.e. 1 leek instead of 3 leeks

Class 61 and 62 Apples should be clean not washed or polished

and have a natural bloom. Should be shown

with stalks down on the plate.

Class 63 1 plate of six stoned fruit – stalks attached, not

polished, natural bloom.

Class 64 1 plate of soft fruit – fresh, not soft. Stalks or

strigs attached.

<u>Flowers</u>

Classes 12 – 13 Carnations must have stems of Dianthus foliage

in the vase

Class 67 1 vase of mixed flowers - A vase of mixed flowers

should contain between 5 and 10 stems, taken from

a minimum of two different kinds of plants.

Please note that this means two different KINDS of plants: two varieties of the same flower are NOT two

different KINDS.

Only fresh HOME GROWN flowers can be used in the vase.

Exhibitors are asked to name their exhibits to help the public to enjoy the Show. Cards for this purpose are available from the Show Recorder.

Staging this year is from 7.30pm to 9.00 pm on Friday and from 7.30 am to 10.45 am on the Saturday of the show, when the hall will be cleared for judging.

The Society will take reasonable care of exhibits before and during the shows but will not be responsible for any loss or damage incurred by or to the exhibitor or any of his/her exhibits.

The Society has appointed competent Judges and their decisions will be final when an exhibit does not comply with the rules. The Judges have the power to give extra awards where justified or withhold any prize that is considered in their opinion deficient in merit. No exhibitor shall judge or steward in a section in which they are exhibiting. Vegetable Classes are judged under N.V.S rules, other Horticultural Classes are judged under R.H.S. rules.

Exhibitors who have won 3 First prizes in any class of any show are not eligible to exhibit as a novice in classes 67 to 72.

In the case of a tie for a trophy/award the exhibitor with the most firsts will be declared the winner. Trophy winners will be required to sign for all trophies and provide reasonable care of them through the year, returning them in time for the next show.

In assessing points:- 1st Prize = 5 points, 2nd Prize = 3 points, 3rd Prize = 1 point Prize Money in all classes will be:- 1st = £3, 2nd = £2, 3rd = £1 Prize Money will be paid on Show day up to $3.30 \, \text{pm}$, prize money will be deemed as a donation after this time.

The Presentation of Awards will be at 4.00pm. Any exhibits which are donated to the Society may be sold and the proceeds added to Society funds.

Lemon and lime cake

Ingredients

- 100g soft margarine
- 150g self raising flour
- 150g caster sugar
- 2 eggs
- 4 tablespoons milk
- 1 lemon
- 1 lime
- 3 heaped tablespoons of icing sugar

Method

- 1 Pre heat oven to 180C/ 160C fan/ Gas 4.
- 2 Grease and line a 2lb loaf tin.
- 3 Finely grate the rind from the lemon and lime.
- 4 Beat all the ingredients together, except the icing sugar, with the grated rind in a large bowl until smooth and creamy for about 2 minutes.
- 5 Pour the mixture into the loaf tin and bake for 45 minutes or until a skewer comes out clean.
- 6 Remove the cake from the oven and leave it in the tin.
- 7 Squeeze the juice from the lemon and lime and add to the icing sugar in a pan.
- 8 Warm and stir until it makes a syrup.
- 9 Prick over the top of the cake with a skewer while the cake is still hot and pour the syrup over the top.
- 10 Allow the cake to go cold and then remove it from the tin.

SHOW RULES FOR EXHIBITORS

- 1. All classes are open to non-members except the photographic classes.
- All exhibits in the Horticultural Classes (including Novice classes) must be the bona fide property in the possession and upon the premises of the exhibitor for not less than eight weeks prior to the show.
- 3. Exhibitors who have won 3 First Prizes in any Horticultural or Vegetable Class of any show are not eligible to exhibit as a Novice in classes 67 to 72.
- 4. Exhibits in the Children's Classes must be the unaided work of the exhibitor.
- 5. Craft exhibits must have been made by the exhibitor during the 12 months prior to the show.
- 6. Signatures or names on any Craft item must be masked.
- 7. Photographs exhibited in the Garden Society Classes must
 - (a.) have been taken in the 12 months preceding the show and the date it was taken must be on the back of the photograph in ink.
 - (b.) be limited to a max.of 3 entries in each of the Gardening Society classes.
 - (c.) be a fully paid up member of the Society on the date the photograph was taken.
 - (d.) be unmounted and not exceed 7in. x 5in.
- 8. All exhibits in the Home Made Confectionery classes must be home made and to the recipe, where specified.
- 9. Adult fees are 30p per class entry. Children's entries (in any class) are free.
- 10. All completed entry forms must be with the Show Recorder, not later than the Wednesday preceding the Show. Use one entry form per person. Entry forms can also be submitted electronically via email.
- 11. Late entries will be allowed up to 6pm on the Friday before the Show at 30p plus a late entry fee of 25p for each entry. No further entries will be accepted.
- 12. Entry forms for children and those competing for the Claude Lowe Memorial Trophy must be complete with age on the day of show. Children's entries also need to be certified as unaided by the parent/guardian on the entry form.
- 13. The Society reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 14. Exhibits must be staged within the specified time limits and the hall must be vacated during judging or as requested by a steward.
- 15. Exhibitors may provide their own vases, and must not touch or move any other exhibitor's exhibit. Vases are also available from the Society **and must be emptied and clean on return.**
- 16. The Society reserves the right to withhold any Trophy or Award.
- 17. Any protest must be handed in to the Show Manager in writing with a fee of £1 before 3.00pm on Show day, the fee will be returned if the protest is upheld.


